POLICY-TWENTY YEAR OLD HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing, may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20 year old honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20 year old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.
2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. **This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension.** At the end of the extension period the member must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

Disaster and Safety Awareness Training

Hello everyone

I hope everybody is having a safe and enjoyable camping season. Unfortunately, Doreen and I haven't been able to go camping yet this year. By chance did you know June was National Camping Month.

Usually I comment about fire safety/prevention during October which is fire prevention month. But I thought I'd review some fire safety (including wildfire), severe weather, and disaster suggestions for your emergency plans.

- 1) Do you have an emergency plan?
- 2) Do you have an escape route planned? Do you have more than one escape route for your home, basement, garage, workshop, pole barn etc.?
- 3) Are your escape routes clear of obstructions both indoors and outside?
- 4) Do you have a meeting place once you evacuate?
- 5) Are your fire, smoke and CO2 monitors and detectors correctly mounted and working properly
- 6) Do you have fire extinguishers strategically located and in proper working order and condition?
- 7) Do you know the location of your electrical breaker box and the main breaker?
- 8) Do you have the needed items for infants/babies, children etc. Go Bag ready if you have to evacuate?
- 9) Do you have a list of your medications and important papers if you have to evacuate your home? Are your medications handy to grab and take with you?
- 10) Do you have a contact list of friends or relatives for you to call if you have to evacuate?
- 11) Don't forget your pets, do have a Go Bag for them?
- 12) Do you have and electronic Go Bag with all your chargers for cellphones, laptop, tablet, flashlights etc.?
- 13) Do you have and know where your safe areas are for severe weather in your home?
- 14) Do you have more than one evacuation route if you have to leave your home due to fire, storms or disaster?

Do you practice your fire safety, severe weather/disaster plans with your RV for camping and travel trips as you do for your home.

So, what's the reason behind this review on emergency preplanning?

In the early morning hours (approx. 3:30 am) of June 1st, campers at a Mid-Michigan Campground were awoken to a large fire which involved and destroyed several campers, a couple rental cabins, the campground community center building and a portion of the woods surrounding the area. Several fire rescue departments responded, while all occupants escaped with only a couple of minor injuries, there were no fatalities or serious injuries as a result of this disaster. The cause of the fire is still under investigation by numerous agencies and companies.

Current escape time estimates from a structure fire (house) is approximately 2-3 minutes from alarm time, while escape times from an RV fire is approximately 1 minute from alarm time. Your RV emergency plans should pretty much resemble your home plans along with a couple more which are:

- 1) Know the location of the emergency egress windows in your RV and how to open and use them. Campers/RV's have limited space, so try to keep these areas clear. Also keep the outdoor areas under the egress windows free from clutter as well.
- 2) Avoid overloading your RV electrical system along with the electrical pedestal which your RV is plugged into. Always use some type of surge protector. There are numerous brands and styles to choose from.

Don't forget to be aware of RV, campground and campsite hazards that may exist that could create an emergency situation for you.

- 1) Propane leaks
- 2) Power surges
- 3) Battery explosions, (camper batteries, chargers, electric bikes, scooters, toys etc.)
- 4) Bonfires, (bigger is not always better, dry, drought conditions, wind)
- 5) Fireworks, Chinese Lanterns/Paper Lanterns
- 6) BBQ grills,
- 7) Mother Nature, severe weather, tornadoes, lightning, high winds, heavy rainfall, flash flooding
- 8) Campsites with overhead tree limbs/branches above your camper
- 9) Stored fuel cans for golf carts and other equipment

When camping, keep in mind during severe weather watches and warnings that the bathroom/shower buildings are usually the storm shelters for the campground, there may be other buildings that the campground representatives may point out. Unfortunately some of these campground storm shelter buildings don't have the capacity for the entire campground population. Check with campground personnel for back up shelter areas. Most campgrounds also have some type of severe weather alert system.

If you have any questions or concerns about your campsite or camping area just stand back and look over your site and area. Look at your neighboring campsites, look at the trees with overhanging limbs and branches, electrical pedestals, water and sewer hookups. Do neighboring campers have BBQ grills, flammable materials [etc.to](#) close to your RV or site. Talk to your neighboring campers about your concerns or to the campground representatives. How do you park your vehicles when your camping, do you back them in your parking area facing the roadways for easy exit in case you have to leave quickly.

Everything I've talked about here is just a brief listing of things to be aware of and to plan and practice for. You can go online to FEMA, US Fire Administration, Homeland Security/Emergency Management, Do 1 Thing, American Red Cross to name a few sites for help in creating your own emergency plans or any other information you may be interested in.

With all the hot and humid weather we've had and with more to follow, let's not forget to plan for our own personal health and well being. Stay hydrated, limit caffeine, energy drinks, pop, and alcohol. Eat properly, if working outside take plenty of breaks, don't over exert yourself and don't be afraid to ask for help doing outside projects, Do some of your outside work in the morning or evening hours when its cooler, if possible stay inside with the air conditioning. Use the buddy system, call and check on family and friends during heat alert days.

No matter where you're at, be safe, look things over, and always have a plan.

Recipe Corner



S'mores Brownies

Prep Time	30 minutes
Cook Time	45 minutes
Total Time	1 hour 15 minutes
Servings	12

Ingredients

Graham Cracker Crust:

- 1.5 packages graham crackers ~2 cups crumbs or a half a box
- 1 stick salted melted butter 113 g
- ¼ cup granulated sugar 50 g

Brownies:

- 1 batch of 9x13 brownies our recipe is below or even a box mix will work!

Marshmallow icing:

- 4 egg whites
- 1 cup sugar 200 g
- ¼ teaspoon cream of tartar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla or 1 tablespoon vanilla bean paste

Instructions

Graham cracker crust:

1. Preheat the oven to 350 F
2. In a food processor or with a ziploc bag/rolling pin, grind 1 package of graham crackers until fine
3. As soon as the crackers are fine, combine with melted butter and ¼ cup sugar
4. Mix together until it is a consistent mixture
5. Pour the crust into a parchment lined 9x13 pan
6. Press the mixture down with your fingers until it forms an even, compact layer
7. Bake for 15 minutes and set aside to cool while you make the brownies






Brownies:

1. Preheat the oven and mix brownie batter according to brownie instructions
2. Pour the brownie batter over the graham cracker crust and smooth the top with a spatula.
3. Bake according to instructions.
4. Let cool completely on a wire rack.

Marshmallow icing:

1. Use a double boiler or create one using a bowl and pan. Fill the pan with ~1" warm water and place a bowl over the pan so it can heat the egg whites with the steam, but it should not touch the bottom
2. Add egg whites, sugar, and cream of tartar to the bowl. Place the bowl over the warm water. The pan should not touch the bottom but be heated by the steam
3. On low, heat the egg white mixture stirring constantly until gently warmed and the sugar is dissolved. Be very careful at this stage to not let the egg whites cook. Scrape the sides of the pan, stir constantly, and remove when sugar dissolves
4. Once dissolved, whip the egg whites on high until stiff peaks form. The mixture will be very glossy and thick. When you place the whisk into the eggs and pull up, it should create a peak. Once it reaches this point, add in the vanilla
5. Top the brownies with the icing and blow torch them for a toasted marshmallow topping and true s'mores taste. If you don't have a blowtorch, place them on broil in the oven for 1-2 minutes until golden on top (keep a close eye on them)
