News

April is here which means graduation is only weeks away. Time to gather the required documents and complete your scholarship application for submittal. Scholarship deadline and requirements are as follows:

- 1) Application deadline: June 1st
- 2) All applications mailed by U.S. mail must have a legible post office marked date stamp on the envelope to be accepted for judging. Applications emailed will be accepted by the date and time on the email.
- 3) Applicants must have a minimum 2.0 grade point average based on a 4.0 grading scale.
- 4) The applicant **or** applicant’s parents must have attended at least one (1) Michigan FCRV campout in the previous year and camped/stayed overnight one night. The qualifying campouts are: MSA State Spring, MSA State Fall campout and a District campout.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Teens living at home planning to attend college or a trade school, upon turning 20 years of age, will need to request a 20-year old’s honorary membership from the Michigan State Director to apply for a free membership. To be eligible for a National or Michigan FCRV scholarship, you must be a **member in good standing**. (See policy below)

POLICY-TWENTY YEAR OLD’S HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

1. Any single child of an FCRV member in good standing may at the age of 20, request of the State/Provincial Director that his/her name be placed on the 20-year-old’s honorary membership list. The name, address, and birth date of the 20-year-old will be provided to the national office through the State/Provincial Directors.
2. FCRV will extend the membership of a single child through the age of 24 if that individual is in the military or a student in college or technical school. **This extension ceases upon leaving college, release from the military, marriage, or lack of application to the State/Provincial Director EACH year for a membership extension.** At the end of the extension period the members must pay for a renewal at the going rate.

Hello Everyone,

I had planned on another topic to write about, but with the recent storms and tornadoes, I decided to write about Emergency Family Communication Plan instead. Most people have been doing these things for years, maybe not to this extent.

So what is an Emergency Family Communications Plan?

It's a pre-written informational outline for how and what family members should do to share safety status, reconnect, and meet if separated during a crisis.

There are several categories of an emergency plan. You can be as detailed as you want, but keep in mind the minimum information you should list.

- 1) Communication Plan
- 2) Potential Disasters
- 3) Meeting Location
- 4) Evacuation or Shelter In Place
- 5) Emergency Kits
- 6) Special Needs/Key Considerations

Here's a brief description of each category.

COMMUNICATION PLAN –should include.

- 1) In case of emergency contacts (ICE) i.e. father, mother, brother, sister, son, daughter, friend etc.
- 2) Out of area contact, someone a distance away from your home and disaster location.
- 3) Text over calling information, texting information is quicker and doesn't tie up cellphone towers in the same way as texting. Especially during storms and disasters.
- 4) Emergency contact cards, wallet sized cards with contact information.
- 5) Social media, posts, private messages etc.

POTENTIAL DISASTERS

- 1) Discuss possible disaster risks with family, (severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, snow/ice storms, flooding, man-made disasters etc)
- 2) Local risks (flooded/washed out roads, bridges in your area, local chemical storage, etc.)
- 3) Establish responsibilities, who will do what, and when to do it.

MEETING LOCATIONS—always choose 2 locations

- 1) Outside your home, (out building, pole barn etc.)
- 2) Your neighborhood, (neighbor #1, neighbor #2 etc.)
- 3) Outside your neighborhood, (relative home, township hall, church, school or store parking lot)

EVACUATION or SHELTER IN PLACE (Listen for emergency alerts advising what to do)

- 1) Follow designated evacuation routes.
- 2) Identify multiple routes from home and your neighborhood.
- 3) Plan for evacuation in your vehicle, on foot, ORV/UTV, public transportation etc.
- 4) Keep your contacts updated on your condition and location
- 5) Keep One or two road maps with you and know how to read them

SHELTER IN PLACE

1) Plan ahead, identify safest room in your home for emergencies like severe weather, man Made disasters etc.

2) Have 72 hours of supplies available, water, non-perishable food, flashlights, batteries, other emergency lighting, a weather radio, or a cordless radio.

EMERGENCY KITS --- Go Bags, Evacuation Kit, 72 hr Kit, Grab N Go Bag etc.

1) Whatever you want to call your kit be sure it contains, basic supplies, safety items, personal needs, your important documents.

2) Kits should include 3 days (72 hrs) worth of supplies, minimum 1 gal water per person per day, medications, 1 st aid kit, etc.

3) Kits should be family specific, adults, kids, elderly, handicapped, pets.

4) Kits should be easily accessible and manageable to carry, (tote, backpack etc.)

5) Consider making a checklist or inventory list for items to pack.

6) Electronic Go Bag, should contain chargers for your cellphones, Ipads, Laptop, cordless flashlights, cordless radio etc.

SPECIAL NEEDS—SPECIFIC NEEDS

This category like some of the previous listed categories may overlap on suggestions, content etc.

1) Elderly/Handicapped—special dietary needs, medications, oxygen, hearing aids and batteries, walkers, wheelchairs, mobile transit units, hand sanitizer etc.

2) Pets--- food, water, medication, licenses and other paperwork, shelters, transportation, collars, leashes. Etc.

3) Medications---Refrigeration needed, syringes, proper storage, Doctor and pharmacy contacts etc.

4) Infants/Toddlers/Kids—formula, bottles, diapers, wipes, hand sanitizer, car seats, games etc

5) Important Documents--- safe storage, , birth certificates, marriage license, passport, SSN, Medical information, insurance (medical, life, home, property, vehicle) , power of attorney, will, DNR paperwork, etc.

6) Livestock—shelter in place, food, water, veterinarian information, etc.

Once you're satisfied your plan is complete review it, maintain it, practice it with regular drills, Educate your kids with it. More information and details can be added or subtracted as needed.

Be sure to review and practice any plan updates. Make sure your family knows where your Emergency Family Communications Plan is and if there's copies.

Sample plans and blank plan forms are available for download online through FEMA, Ready.gov, Red Cross along with further information.

This article and information is to get you thinking and planning ahead of time for those “what if situations” that could occur.
